

Many: the whispered rumour of a different order,







The **paraments** are **white** today for **Transfiguration Sunday**. On this day we celebrate the event recorded in the gospels in which Jesus suddenly changes in appearance: he becomes radiant, is called "Son" by God, and speaks with Moses and Elijah. In Christian tradition, the Transfiguration is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place for the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus himself as the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth. Symbolically, Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets respectively, and their recognition of and conversation with Jesus reinforces the fact that Jesus came to fulfill "the law and the prophets."
