Service Notes

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *Lenten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring temptation and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, self-reflection, and preparation for the coming of Easter. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

Palm Sunday is the first day in Holy Week, also known as Passion Week. Jesus, the long-awaited Messiah, rode into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey, not a symbol of power and prestige, but rather of humility. The people rejoiced to see the great teacher and healer by laying palm fronds and cloaks in the street before him, a communal symbol of respect in the Ancient Near East. This event is in all four canonical Gospels (Mk 11:1–11, Matt 21:1–11, Lk 19:28–44, Jn 12:12–19).

The **Pipe Organ** that our organist, Denise Lanning, is playing for our pre-recorded video worship services during the COVID-19 outbreak is an instrument in her home. It is a four rank, two manual (keyboard) organ with full pedalboard, and was built for her by Charles Ruggles of Conifer, Colorado.

The **Prelude** by German composer Georg Friedrich Kauffman (1679-1735) is based on the hymn-tune "All Glory, Laud, and Honor", number 175 in our hymnal. Kauffman was a prolific composer of hymn-tune based organ compositions, as was typical of church musicians of his era. The melody of "All Glory, Laud, and Honor" is in the top voice, and can be easily heard.

The **Processional Reading** is led by **Corry & Phil Doty**. Corry and Phil have been part of Calvary for 50+ years. Daughters Sarah and Anne grew up in Denver and at Calvary. Both Corry and Phil are CPA's. In his career in public accounting, Phil served clients for more than 50 years and will soon retire from Plante Moran. Phil has served on the boards of a number of community and professional organizations and on Calvary's Finance Committee as Treasurer. Corry is a full-time community volunteer. She has served Calvary as Moderator, Marketing Committee Chair, Coordinator or Co-Chair of 15 Stewardship Campaigns, 15 years on Resource Management, Chair of the Columbarium Committee since 2003, and dozens of shorter term responsibilities. Phil and Corry are in the Koinonia Class.

The **Shofar** (שופר) is a ram's-horn 'trumpet' of ancient Israel and modern Jewish worship. In both ancient and modern usage, this instrument is sounded to announce holidays (Ps. 81:3) and pronounce processions (II Sam. 6:15).

The **Sounding of the Shofar** is given by **Rev. Brenda J. Goodman**. Brenda grew up here at Calvary and serves as a rotational leader with Common Table, Common Life, Healing and Wholeness services, and other creative and pastoral needs, including co-coordinating the Art Show Ministry Team. She was ordained at Calvary and is a chaplain at Sky Ridge hospital. She loves running, waterskiing, writing, reading, photography, trumpet, and the arts. Brenda and her husband, John have two children, Taylor and Nathan.

Today's **Vocal Leadership** is by **Anne Comstock**. Anne and her husband, Jim, joined Calvary in 2000. She is blessed daily by the Calvary community and has served in many diverse ways from music to nursery! Anne has worked in the child welfare field for 30 years and especially enjoys her role of grandma to five amazing grandkids.

The "**Blessing of Palms**" Poem is read by **Rev. Krysta Balgien**. Krysta has been a member of Calvary since 2012 and was ordained to ministry at Calvary in 2013. Krysta is a chaplain at Children's Hospital Colorado. She loves being an aunt and spends her free time hiking, volunteering with Special Olympics basketball and soccer, and connecting with friends. At Calvary, Krysta has used her gifts to serve in a number of ways - through preaching and worship leadership, serving on Council, and volunteering at PRIDEfest.

The **Call for the Offering** is given by **John Kron**. John and his wife Kathy joined Calvary 45 years ago. John is a retired high school teacher. At Calvary, John is the Chair of the Stewardship Committee, serves on Council, co-teaches the Koinonia Church School Class, and is involved with the Men's Group. In his spare time he enjoys movies, music, theatre, and chairing his HOA Landscape Committee.

Calvary: IN Response! This stewardship emphasis carries over the theme from last fall's stewardship campaign, "I'm IN!". It will highlight a different theme each week, beginning April 5, culminating on Sunday, May 3. Together we will stay IN-Side, stay IN Touch, stay IN-Volved. Together IN Faith and IN Unity we will meet our Needs, as Calvary rises up IN Response to this current global crisis. This week we are focusing on two themes:

- First, we are **IN-Side**. As we stay at home, Calvary is finding ways to cope with physical isolation by creating online Sunday worship services, encouraging spiritual growth through Lenten Sabbath Moments, and maintaining valued Calvary traditions virtually through Holy Week worship/devotional opportunities. Of course, being home-bound provides ample time for personal reflection and spiritual practice.
- Second, we are **IN Touch**. Through our Calvary Care Team check-ins, Calvary Zoom meetings and gatherings, social media contacts, and telephone communication, Calvary is checking up on our church family members. We are also coordinating shopping or essential errands for members who cannot get out. While practicing "social distancing" and staying home per our Governor's instructions, we are still maintaining our connections with one another.

Help us spread the message on social media! Share our Facebook posts with your friends and contacts. We will be tracking the "spread" of this generosity, publicizing the number of donations rather than the accumulated amount. Every contribution helps! Together Calvary will weather this storm since we are, as always, ALL IN!

The **Offertory** is sung by sisters, **Lucy Crile and Carly Crile**. Lucy is in 8th grade and Carly is in 5th grade; both attend Murphy Creek K-8 School. Their hobbies include singing with the Colorado Children's Chorale, music,

performing, watching movies, family board-game nights, and playing with their dog Violet. Their parents are Emily and Cory and their family has been attending Calvary for over ten years.

The **Gospel Reading** is read by **Rick Breitenbecher**. Rick has been active at Calvary since September 2014. He is a baritone in the Calvary Choir, the Co-Moderator of Council, and plays piano and organ on occasion. Rick was active in the former Crystal Cathedral Choir (Garden Grove, CA) for 18 years, and served as the Cathedral's carillonneur for eight years. He is employed as a Senior Analyst for Verizon Wireless. In his spare time, Rick plays the Williams Carillon at Denver University, and is interested in early to mid 20th century architecture. Rick and his husband Christopher Hermosillo were married at Calvary in December of 2019.

The **Scripture** for today comes from **Year 2 (Mark)** of the **Narrative Lectionary (NL)**, a four-year cycle of readings for use in worship that provide an overview of the biblical story by focusing on a different gospel and different Old and New Testament texts each year. The NL follows the program year—Sept. to May—and is shaped by the church calendar:

- *Old Testament*: From Labor Day through Advent, Old Testament readings move through the story of God's interactions with Israel and culminate in Advent with the prophets' longing and hope for the coming Messiah.
- *Gospel*: From Christmas to Easter, readings from one Gospel tell the story of the birth of the Messiah at Christmas, the revelation of the Messiah during Epiphany, and Jesus' passion through Lent and Holy Week.
- *Early Church*: From Easter Sunday through the Day of Pentecost, readings from the Gospels, Acts, and Paul's letters reveal the power of the Holy Spirit in the early church's story.
- Summer Readings from the Sunday after Pentecost through the summer are flexible and include different miniseries on books of the bibles or topics such as The Ten Commandments or the Lord's Prayer, etc.

The **Sung Response** to Scripture (which we will sing throughout the season of Lent) comes from our hymnal, *Celebrating Grace*, and is based on the scripture Micah 6:8.

Today's **Sung Response** and **Song of Response** is led by **Rev. Matt Nelson**. Matt is a part of Calvary's staff, and can be seen leading The Gathering worship music every Sunday evening.

Today's **worship video** was compiled by **Damon Scalfaro**. Sermons are usually uploaded to Calvary's Facebook page, YouTube page, and website within 24 hours following worship.

Hosting Families Experiencing Homelessness through Family Promise Looks Different During COVID-19... Here's How You Can Help: With the COVID-19 pandemic it has been especially difficult for those

experiencing homelessness and the Family Promise community has been working hard at finding a new way of supporting this at risk community.

Currently the families that Family Promise is hosting have been staying in local motels. Since they will be staying in motels we will need to raise funds through Calvary and our partner hosts churches to help pay for the rooms, purchase supplies, breakfast/lunch foods needed during the week and provide meals through ordering from locally owned restaurants to be delivered to the families.

Our upcoming host week is April 26 - May 3. As a community we need to raise about \$2500 to cover the costs of these resources needed during our host week.
