

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ² He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³ Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵ Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶ What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷ Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁸ The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹ Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰ Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹ "Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹² If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴ And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 8 To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. 11 All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.



Today is the **Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost**, which is part of the season of **Ordinary Time**, representing the "greening" of the Spirit. In the ancient church, this season coincided with the "springing forth" of God's spirit following Pentecost, just as spring bursts forth with new life in the perpetual seasons of our lives. There are two periods of Ordinary Time in the liturgical year. The first is after Epiphany Sunday through Ash Wednesday. The second is between the Monday after Pentecost and the first Sunday of Advent. Ordinary Time is the longest season in the liturgical year. The **paraments** are **green** during Ordinary Time.

The **Prelude** is a composition by Boston area organist and composer, and graduate of Valparaiso and New England Conservatory Louise Mundinger. It is based on the hymn-tune CANTAD AL SENOR (Sing to the Lord), #328 in our hymnal Celebrating Grace. It is one of a collection of pieces for Bayoubüchlein, a project of the 2016 Houston

National Convention of the American Guild of Organists. These pieces for organ were composed by AGO members and were presented as a gift to all convention attendees.

The **Call to Worship** is written by Joanna Harader (spaciousfaith.com) and is led by **Susan Wirt**, who is also reading the New Testament Scripture today. Susan has been a Calvary member since 1986 and has served on various committees and in various volunteer roles. She is retired and enjoys hiking and reading.

The Word for God's Children is led by Becky Whitaker. Becky was born and raised in Tulsa, Oklahoma. She and her husband, Bruce, are lifelong American Baptists who met at Ottawa University in Kansas. Their sons, Jeff and Peter, grew up attending Calvary, and their daughter-in-law, Ashley, was ordained as an American Baptist minister at Calvary, Becky and Bruce have two grandchildren, Isaac and Lydia, In the Denyer community, Becky volunteers virtually as an oral storyteller with elementary students and as an ESL tutor with adults. At Calvary, she is part of the Facing Racism cohort at Calvary and is the co-lead from Calvary with the Stedman Elementary School reading partnership with New Hope Baptist Church.

The **Gospel Reading** is read by **Amy Kehew.** Amy joined Calvary in 2018 when she moved to Denver from Massachusetts after teaching third grade for 46 years. Amy is Calvary's Music Librarian, sings in the Calvary Choir, plays in JuBellation (handbell choir), and serves on the Stewardship Committee. She attends Theology Pub, the Midweek Zoom Gathering, and Tuesday Prayer & Study Group. She likes to read, garden, and do counted crossstitching.

Today's Message is the thirteenth sermon in a 14-week series called, Free to Be: how Baptist identity can be a source of belonging and becoming, which is an exploration of Baptist identity, freedoms, ordinances. and associations. This summer series explores the question: Why Baptist? What does it mean to be Baptist and how can our Baptist identity be a source of belonging and becoming? For Baptists, faith means both freedom for the individual and formation in community. Perhaps in understanding our heritage more fully, we will hear – in new ways – who God is calling us to be and how God is freeing us to live. Please join us on Tuesday nights as we continue the conversation each week on Zoom!

The **Postlude** is part of a collection by German organist and composer Hermann Schroeder (1904-1984) entitled Short Preludes and Intermezzos. He employs parallel thirds and fifths in the opening and closing sections with a short imitative middle section. He studied at the University of Innsbruck, and at the Musikhochschule in Cologne where he later became assistant director.
