


Baptism of Our Lord Sunday

The *Thriving in Goodness* Touchstone Symbols in your Order of Worship signal times when we invite you to engage in that practice. The 18 touchstones are divided into 9 pairs; we are focusing on one pair at a time throughout the year. The symbols are a guide; you may experience these practices at other times in worship or in a different way than we have indicated. That is okay; follow the Spirit's leading! The intention for including these symbols is to 1) draw our attention to where we naturally engage with these practices in our worship, 2) become aware of their impact in helping us tether ourselves to our Created Goodness, so that 3) we become intentional about utilizing these practices in our everyday lives outside of worship so that we Thrive by creating Good in our lives and in the world.

You are welcome in worship just as you are this morning. Acknowledging that the Spirit connects with us in different ways, as we sing, pray, and worship together may you receive whatever resonates with you, and release what doesn't.

The **paraments** are **white** for **Baptism of Our Lord.** White is used for all high Holy Days and festival days of the Church Year, especially the seasons of Christmas and Easter. White symbolizes purity, holiness, and virtue, as well as respect and reverence. The season of Epiphany emphasizes the manifestations of God to humans through Jesus and how the presence of Christ is mysteriously revealed in our lives and in the world. We are invited to experience divine revelation in ways that surprise us.

The **Call to Worship** is sourced from calltoworshipjournal.org and is led by **Katherine Dunn**. Katherine has been attending Calvary for a few years and was baptized on Palm Sunday 2024. She plays competitive soccer, piano, and volleyball, and loves spending time with her family: mom and dad Matt & Terri Dunn, and siblings Luke, Beatrice, and John.

The Word for God's Children is given by Erin Gangloff. Erin has been a Calvary member since birth in 1983. She was dedicated, baptized, married, and had her own daughter (Aubrey Leigh) dedicated in the church. You can say that Calvary is a family affair, as her parents (Tim and Leigh Bessey) and grandparents are members. Erin is the Chief Marketing Officer for the Colorado Golf Association. She serves as Co-Moderator of our deacons. In her spare time, you will find her and her husband watching their daughter dance, swim, or playing golf!

The **Thriving in Goodness moment** is given by **Rev. Brenda J.R. Goodman**. Rev. Brenda J.R. Goodman grew up at Calvary, and is a member of Calvary's Facing Racism Cohort, Calvary's Gun Violence Prevention group, a rotational leader of Word For God's Children, and a Lifeline volunteer. She was ordained at Calvary in 2014, and is a hospital chaplain at Sky Ridge, and a float chaplain for Swedish. She loves running, writing, audiobooks, podcasts, movies & TV, photography, digital scrapbooking,

trumpet, and all genres of music, especially 80's, jazz, and classical. Brenda and her partner, John, have two adult children, Taylor & Nathan, two cats, Kevin & Quincy, & Greyhound, Max. Brenda is part of three generations of Calvary members including her mother, Earlene Ramay, and her late father, Carl Ramay.

Calvary receives the **Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering (RMMO)** during the month of January. The roots of RMMO go back to the mid-1930s, when American Baptist congregations received a Communion Fellowship Offering on the first Sunday of each month to support retired ministers, missionaries, their widowed spouses, and elderly clergy within their churches. In 1977, American Baptist Churches USA launched RMMO to continue this appreciation of God's service. The offering supports those who have dedicated their lives to God's service in ABC-USA for 15 or more years with a thank you check and provides emergency assistance in times of need. The **Gospel Reading** (Year C, Revised Common Lectionary) is read by **Malcolm Floyd.** Malcolm and his mom Shirley joined Calvary in October of this year. Malcolm works as a behavioral health technician for the Mile High Recovery Center.

Today's Message is the second sermon in the epiphany/new year series, *Hold Fast & Reorient*, which is part of our annual series, *Thriving in Goodness for Good and for GOOD*. A full theme description may be found on the kiosk. Here is a summary: Jesus reminds us, "The thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy. I came so that they might have abundant life—indeed, so that they might live life to the fullest," (John 10:10, CEB). Jesus' invitation to thrive in an abundant life is rooted in our original goodness—God proclaiming humanity as tov meod (very good) in the Creation story. To thrive in an abundant life, we first must dwell within our own created goodness—for in doing so, we will see the good in others and be the good for the world. When we thrive in the midst of this goodness, we 1) create Good within ourselves and in the world for others (in the here and now), and 2) we co-create the kin-dom of God for GOOD (the ultimate reality when all is finally and forever well with the world—when justice, mercy, and peace flow and exist for all). In other words, when we are able to thrive in our goodness it is not only for the Good of the world "here and now," it also creates the kin-dom of God which eradicates all pain, injustice, evil, and sin for GOOD, forever!

Throughout the year we're exploring 18 touchstones (9 pairs of practices) of *Thriving in Goodness*—the Goodness in which God created us and for which God intends for us to live. These touchstones include practices and rhythms that serve as reminders of our goodness; they shape our worship experience together, and they can shape our daily lives if we practice them with intention.

From Property Deacon Bill Warren & Pastor Anne: Spoofing Alert

Please be aware that spoofing emails went out under Pastor Anne's name this week asking for gift cards and other favors. These are *NOT* from Pastor Anne. Spoofing is when someone changes a "display name" to suggest to the email receiver that they are someone other than who they are.

No pastor or staff member will ever ask you to buy gift cards for the church over email. You may double check emails claiming to be from Anne by looking at the *email address* (not the name) and ensure it is from ascalfaro@calvarydenver.org. Spoofers will often make up an email through gmail or yahoo that looks similar my real one.

If you receive an email that seems suspicious or that asks for any favor that is financial in nature, please or call or text Pastor Anne directly or call the church office. Because of the nature of these incidents, we work hard to eliminate all email addresses from the website; however we were able to locate the webpage that had the email addresses on it and removed them immediately. Thank you to all who reported the issue so we could act as quickly as possible.

Note: Calvary's email system, database, and financial system were not hacked and are secure.
