and a Word from Pastor Anne

On Gathering Sunday, we announced our theme for the year: "Yes, And....". Improv comedy thrives on the idea of "Yes, and...": taking whatever the present moment gives you, and adapting your responses and decisions accordingly. You say your own improvised line, and your part-

ner can take it in any direction they choose. It requires trust, letting go of control, and guts.

Life is a lot like improv comedy. We can plan for some things, but we can't predict everything; having flexibility and a willingness to listen and learn is key. The more we are tuned in to one another, the richer our storyline and the more we grow. Life, and faith, is not a solo stand-up act; it needs an ensemble cast. And God is one of the greatest improvisers.

Throughout Scripture and our own lives, we experience God as a God of "Yes, and...".

Yes, God is the divine creator...and God wants to create with us.

Yes, we sin in the world... and we are invited to practice confession and repentance.

Yes, we have our theological beliefs... and we are called to learn and grow throughout our lives.

Yes, Calvary has needs within our church community... and we are called to care for those not a part of our community.

Yes, we have ministries and programming... and we seek to have them support our spiritual practices.

Yes, we want to grow as a congregation... and we are grateful for all who are already present.

To live into the practice of "Yes, and..." is to free ourselves from programmatic demands while opening ourselves to the present needs of our spiritual health. It's easy to get stuck in our faith and in our relationships and conversations with others; by taking our cue from improv comedy and using the principal of "Yes, and...", we learn how to move pass the barriers that can

feel like roadblocks, and navigate a new way.

Scripture is full of stories of people who are taken on journeys they did not expect. This year, in our worship services and in small group experiences and discussions, we are going to have some fun with our faith and engage the Spiritual Practices of "Yes, and...". Taking improv as a spiritual practice allows us to live into the reality that God loves us where we are in life and will find ways to move us into further health and wholeness.

A Sit-Down with Our Council Co-Moderators



Recently Pastor Alice got to sit down for an interview with Calvary's co-moderators of Council, **Larry Dávila and Sharon Murphy**. Larry is in his 3rd year as co-moderator, and Sharon is in her 2nd. Larry is one of the teachers for the Explorers Church School class, and is a retired teacher from Aurora Public Schools. He has also served as President of the Aurora Mental Health Center. Sharon has been a lawyer in estate planning for forty years, and she previously served as moderator in the late 1980s.

Describe your role as moderators:

S: It's part facilitator, part organizer, and part co-chairman of the board.

L: We are enabling the church to fulfill its mission, to care for each other, and trying to imitate what Jesus did.

What do you enjoy about being moderators?

S: Being on Council has given me an opportunity to see the broader picture of what's going on at Calvary and that's even more true as co-moderator.

L: My idea of leadership for a long time is that it's not from the top down, it's from the bottom up.

S: When you work on a project or a committee, you get to know people better and you begin to see what their skills and passions are. And it's rewarding that some are people that I didn't know before.

L: We all have our strengths and not-so-strong points. I'll be leading and Sharon will say, 'have you ever thought about it this way?' I like that we complement each other quite a bit.

What are some of the challenges of being moder- room. All are welcome to attend! ators on Council?

S: One thing that was difficult was working on the budget reconciliation committee, the committee that addresses all the budget requests in light of information about pledges and other income. There are things that we want to do, things we should be doing, that we can't afford to do.

L: Sometimes it is hard to find the balance between an efficient meeting and a team-building meeting. An efficient meeting works well to present the topics, questions to the point, decide, and move on. But that's not a team-building meeting with give and take.

How has your co-moderator role influenced your faith and relationship with God?

S: Being co-moderator has encouraged me to become more intentional about attending my church school class, and that has led me to ponder my relationship with God more than I probably did in some prior years. Concepts which are mentioned in Council meetings sometimes open my eyes to a different way of perceiving a situation, and that also helps me grow.

L: My relationship with God is a very private kind of thing. There may be a concern or a worry, but as I've gotten older, my faith has gotten deeper. My sense is that my God will see me through this.

What makes you excited about Calvary's future?

L: We're living in difficult times. Attendance has dwindled. All sociological studies show that it's just going to keep going down. We still have a faith to share, a mission to accomplish, and that's not going to disappear because a family or person left the church.

S: When things were in turmoil in the past, we realized how important it is to support one another and to support Calvary and to seek God's guidance. It is good to remember these learnings even when we are not in obvious turmoil. Also, the increasing emphasis that our mission is outside the church walls is something that we're growing into, and I think that will be important.

L: The inclusiveness that we have been stating and implementing, that it doesn't matter if you're black, white, gay, straight. No matter what, you are welcome. There is strength in that.



Calvary Volunteer Profile



One of the opportunities we offer at Calvary are GPS (God-People-Service) Small Groups. These are often semester-based classes, although some are offered year-round. You might think this is coordinated by pastoral staff, but it's organized by a volunteer, **Deanna Geldens.** Learn more about her in this issue's Volunteer Profile!

What motivated you to become Calvary's GPS/Small Group Coordinator and how and when did that come about?

I have been involved with Calvary's Scrapbooking GPS group since it started four or five years ago. That group was a non-threatening way for me to get involved at a time when my life was crazy. I went through at least one registration cycle wondering if Andrew needed any help with that process - but at the time, I didn't follow up. When I learned months later that Pastor Andrew was leaving Calvary, I immediately wondered about the small group ministry. During a service on Sunday morning a few weeks later, I really felt an urgent need to volunteer in some way, no matter how small. I thought Anne and Morgan must be feel-

ing overwhelmed and I thought that the GPS ministry was important to keep going. When I approached Anne after service and volunteered, the look on her face confirmed that God had been speaking. She told me that she and Morgan had just been wondering what to do about the GPS groups. I'm glad I didn't wait and I haven't regretted that decision.

What is the most rewarding thing about being the GPS Coordinator?

Since becoming the GPS coordinator, I have met a ton of people at Calvary. I would recognize their faces, but I'm finally getting to know some names.

What is the most difficult or stressful part of your volunteer position?

I worry about my group leaders. They make a commitment and get excited about doing a group. Sometimes we don't get enough registrations for that group to come to fruition. I don't want them to get discouraged. I wish that there were more people coming to Calvary, so everyone who volunteered to do a group would get the registrations they need.

What is your favorite thing about Calvary?

I love that Calvary is open to everyone. It's great having diversity in our community and I wish we had more. I grew up in a very judgmental denomination. I know I can invite anyone to Calvary. If they are so conservative that they feel uncomfortable here, well...I'm okay with that. I think Jesus would be too.

What do you for for your day job, and how does that help you in your coordinator volunteer position?

Right now, I run my own marketing communications business - a company of one. I really like the flexibility and I get to do a variety of projects for different companies and nonprofits. That flexibility allows
