All: we confess our own participation in that darkness as people who sometimes fail to be the Light of Christ to the world.


Welcome & Time of Greeting







The paraments are purple today for the Fifth Sunday in Lent. Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Lenten, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring temptation and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, self-reflection, and preparation for the coming of Easter. Calvary's Lenten theme is Challenge + Celebration: "Yes, life pushes you to your limits...and celebration can come in unexpected places."

Today is **Senior Sunday.** We recognize our students who are graduating from high school this year, and celebrate their unique gifts as they lead us in worship. Calvary presents graduating seniors with a "college survival kit."

Extinguishing the Light is led by Lynda and Gordon Pelton. Lynda and Gordon have been key volunteers with our vouth and children for years, as well as Family Promise. Gordon serves as Property Chair on Resource Management and Lynda is on Finance Committee and volunteers in the nursery.
